Squirrel & Acorn Process Art Directions

Step One: Set Up & Paint

Place the squirrel template in a shallow container or a deep lid. Add some spots of brown paint in a few places on the squirrel. Place a handful of acrylic acorns or marbles into the container. Gently tilt the container back and forth so that the acorns run through the paint and spread it across the picture.





Step Two: Cut & Mount

Allow the paint to dry on the squirrel template. Cut out the squirrel and glue it to a piece of construction paper. I prefer to use yellow, orange or red for a festive fall display.
